KNOW YOUR NEIGHBOURHOOD

In November 2022 we were invited to bid for an uplift to our current Digi-Comm project. Funding was made available through the Government Levelling Up fund which aims to:-

- Provide more opportunities for local people through volunteering
 - Expand the pool of volunteers able to provide digital support
 - Enable residents to build their digital confidence
- Establish new opportunities for residents to meet with their neighbours in their own community and thus reduce their social isolation
 - To better utilise facilities within communities
- To provide opportunities for residents to utilise digital skills to access local services ensuring they are better connected

We submitted a bid and were informed in February that we had been successful. The bid will bring in an additional £44,620 for 12 months starting on 1st April 2023.

The additional funding will enable us to pilot the Digi-Comm training approach in new community and residential spaces. It will create a new part time Volunteer Co-Ordinator post to expand the pool of volunteers able to deliver the programme who will recruit train and support volunteers to become digital champions.



SCIPS have now completed delivery of the final two Click & Chat courses funded by our existing Digi Comm programme at the 4 Community Hub in West Bromwich and Brook Street Community Centre in Tipton.

Twelve participants have been guided through content including using a tablet, downloading apps, internet safety, creating an email account and more. In addition three volunteers have completed 'Train the Trainer' courses and have been provided with all the materials and resources to ensure that – coupled with funding we have sourced for infrastructure improvements and broadband costs for 12 months – ongoing delivery can be considered at these venues. We would like to say a huge thank you to everyone who has been involved. (use photos from GoPro – 1 each for 4CH & Brook St).

As you will know, we have also been successful in our application to extend our Digi Comm programme for another 3 years and we are planning with partners at St Albans to commence delivery in the coming months. We are currently developing a good practice guide which will help inform this, based on the learning from our experience to date. This guide, along with information on future courses will soon be available. Watch this space!

You need photo ID to vote at a polling station



Types of accepted photo ID if you vote at a polling station

- Passport
- A photo driving licence (including provisional licence)
- A Blue Badge
- Older Person's Bus Pass
- Disabled Person's Bus Pass
- Freedom Pass
- Identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card)
- Biometric immigration document
- Ministry of Defence Form 90 (Defence Identity Card)
- National identity card issued by an EEA state

Call the Voter ID helpline on 0121 569 6999 or the elections team on 0121 569 3244.



Go into any Sandwell Library or Sandwell Council House in Oldbury for help to apply for a free Voter Authority Certificate. You will need your National Insurance Number.

The deadline for getting a free Voter Authority Certificate to vote at a polling station in the May Local Elections is 5pm on Tuesday 25 April 2023.

You can still use accepted photo ID if it is out of date, as long as it still looks like you.

The name on your ID should be the same name you used to register to vote.

Remember there are other ways to vote.

If you would like to vote by post you can request a postal vote.


